It was great to welcome back Jenny Horsfield as a guest speaker. Last week we heard from Jenny about "A Bookshop in War Time" which covered not only the story of Verity Hewitt's bookshop in Canberra but also covered many of the contemporaneous events during the years of World War 2. In 1938 Verity was married, but unhappy, and loathing housework, she opened Verity Hewitt's Bookshop on 1 April 1938. From second-hand books, it expanded to sell new books, prints and artefacts, and to hold art exhibitions. While it was not a great financial venture, it became a 'pool of light' for the book-starved community, reflecting the friendliness of its owner, who even delivered library books by sulky. Verity went on to have an extraordinary life including studying Russian as well as

Russia's influence in Australia and Afghanistan (where she travelled extensively), and amongst other achievements, was also a part-time teacher at Abbotsleigh!

This coming week we will hear from Fiona Demark, an inspirational speaker and life coach, who will be talking with us about overcoming adversity.

THE TALIBAN HAVE CHILDREN TOO ... A message from the Rotary Foundation.

With the collapse of the government in Afghanistan, many Rotarians have expressed concern about the future of our Polio Eradication Initiative – when ultimate success is so close. There have been only TWO cases of wild polio virus in all of 2021, one in Afghanistan and one in Pakistan. These occurred in January.

At a recent meeting of Rotary polio coordinators, RI Past President and 2021/22 Chair of The Rotary Foundation, John Germ, told the meeting that Rotary's team has been working with the Taliban for some time and we need to remember 'the Taliban have children too – and want them protected against Polio'. 'We acknowledge the tragedy of the ...

... situation in Afghanistan, but there have always been obstacles in the way that have been overcome," he said.

'Historically, the Taliban have never been against Polio vaccination. They are wary of people involved in delivering the vaccines but they want to target the end of Polio and are very well organised.'

'As conflict in Afghanistan quickly evolves, we must advocate for the children of Afghanistan. The Polio program must work and communicate with all stakeholders involved to ensure that polio immunisation remains a priority to ensure the gains we have made against polio do not diminish.

'We look forward to working with our polio eradication partners and the Afghani people to completely eradicate polio,' he concluded.


ROTARY YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM (YEP) Gabriel Mendes, Brazil 2015
