Our guest speaker last week, Ahmed Fattah, talked about Personal Data Literacy. Personal data is a crucial element of our lives but the risks of the loss and abuse of our personal data are real and serious. To protect our personal data we need to be vigilant and enhance our 'personal data literacy'. Risks can include identity theft; scams using social engineering and accessing infected sites by opening emails (phishing); voice calls (vishing); and text messages (smishing); luring unsuspecting individuals to divulge confidential information; and infecting computers laptops and phones with malware. Ahmed also reminded us that if you use a social media web site "for free" you are actually "paying for it" by allowing them to use your personal data to make their profit. Dom Rabu has distributed to members a

copy of Ahmed's presentation which contains many useful links for those who want to go into greater detail and learn more.

This coming week we will hear from Sarah Brown, AM, the CEO of Purple House, which is an innovative indigenous-owned health service operating from its base in

BUSHIRE REMEDIATION PROJECT

Here is the latest update from Club members Blair Leslie and Charlie Barnett.

Together with other Rotary Clubs in the Central West and MacLeay Valley areas we launched a project to help individuals whose home gardens had been destroyed in the bushfires. The project in the Central West area involved working with local nurseries and Rotary Clubs to distribute plants to individual householders and that part of the project has been completed. Once lockdown restrictions are lifted Blair has already identified potential follow-on projects in the Central West with which we could become involved.

It has been more difficult in the Upper MacLeay Valley with the area first impacted by fire then being impacted by flood and the original Council bushfire recovery hub being redirected to flood support. As he is currently living in the area, Charlie has been able to work with the Council and local Rotary Clubs and the proposal now is to build a garden in each of the villages of Bellbrook and Willawarrin. There is a community meeting scheduled for 12th October in Willawarrin to discuss the proposal for that village. The site selected in Bellbrook has now been occupied by fruit bats so further work is still underway there to finalise a site!


ZOOM IN FOR FRIDAY DRINKS
