We heard last week from Margot Whitfield who talked with us about her experiences which led to the establishment of Pacific Dermatology Limited, a DGR-accredited, Australian Not-For-Profit, with a mission to improve skin health in the Pacific, by supporting the education of specialist skin doctors. To achieve this, they have established the Pacific Dermatology Training Centre in Suva to offer post-graduate Diploma and Master's degree courses. It is a partnership with Fiji Ministry of Health, Fiji National University, and volunteer Australian dermatologists. PLAY IT FORWARD SWING UPDATE

As you know we have sponsored one of the "all ability swings" being installed in parks around Mosman. Here is an update from Caroline Ghatt (the co-founder of Play It Forward) on the success of the first swing installed - at Balmoral Beach.

"We're 3 weeks into the Play It Forward campaign with around 10 days to go. So far, the community (despite the rain!) has tallied up more than 70,000 swings for inclusion. They have absolutely smashed our original goal of 25,000 swings in 4 weeks. It's been absolutely incredible – and we are not done yet!

In terms of PR, we've had some great coverage via Mosman Living, The Mosman Daily, Mosman Council e-letter and website pages and via local influencer Gabrielle Bartlett. A few of the screengrabs are below. North Shore Living will hopefully also run a story in one of their upcoming editions too.

PRESENTATIONS FROM THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR


At the Club meeting last Tuesday, District Governor Lindsay May made a number of presentations (which had previously not been able to happen due to COVID).
