Dear Valued Supporter,

October 27th was a great day when an audience of 600 volunteers and supporters attended a function to commemorate our 50,000th wheelchair with the Premier officially opening our new factory

Unlike many charities suffering from depleted income due to COVID-19 we consider ourselves lucky due to the support of people like you, our donations and that means wheelchairs, are holding up.

We have had difficulties due to COVID-19 with receiving countries unable to distribute the wheelchairs to those so desperately in need. In fact, we have had to temporarily reduce production. Our biggest distributor World Vision Australia had to cease wheelchair distribution operations due to cash flow problems but after six months of protracted negotiations by our distribution coordinator volunteer Don Kidson, World Vision USA has come on side. A first container of 340 wheelchairs is on its way to Malawi. Freight and distribution costs which are now very expensive are of course borne by the distributors or their associates.

It now looks like it's all go after Christmas when our volunteers will once again be producing 100+ wheelchairs per week.

When we said we are lucky, we are in fact very lucky, as a generous long-time supporter in Katherine NT, after retiring and selling a cattle station, has paid off our \$2million new factory mortgage. We are now safe for the future with no rent expenses.

\$200 still provides a child with a new strong, rough terrain, adjustable wheelchair built to World Health Organisation specifications and includes postural supports, a tray, basket, knee rug, a complete set of body and foot straps, a soft toy and tool kit. Also, when needed, for the many children with cerebral palsy we include a headrest and knee separator. A recent addition is a cover for the wheel spokes.

Our retiree production volunteers, volunteer management and the ladies (and one or two men) all over Australia who make the rugs, soft toys and sew support covers which go with each wheelchair, all wish you, our supporting partners in this project, once again, our very best wishes for the Christmas Season and thank you again for your ongoing generosity.


My English might not be the same as it was 10 years ago, but I hope the message is understood.
